

Education Becomes Equalized In Third Social

Following the pro and con speeches, Bosnia requested a roll call vote. This means that the chair would call out each country's name and the country's delegate would say if they were pro or con on passing the resolution. Once the votes had been tallied, it was confirmed that 3rd Social committee had passed a resolution by nearly 20 votes encouraging the equalization of primary education.
