BASIC PRINCIPLES OF APPLIED BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS

This course is an introduction to the basic principles and procedures of applied behavior analysis (ABA). Research, theory, ethics, and professional practice will also be addressed. Students will be exposed to a range of applications such as autism/developmental disabilities, geriatrics, and business. Successful completion of this course satisfies the educational requirement for credentialing as a registered behavior technician (RBT) by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board. ETHICS IN RESEARCH AND THERAPY

This course will cover the ethical principles and code of conduct for individuals in various helping professions. Specific topics and case studies will include ethical issues related to competence, human relations, privacy and confidentiality, advertising, record keeping, education and training, research, assessment, and therapy. Ethical codes from the American Psychological Association, American Counseling Association, Behavior Analyst Certification Board, the Association for Applied Sport Psychology, and the American Occupational Therapy Association will be the primary resources.
