Open Mic Night - Rules:

- 1. This is a general guide. Please note that updates may be made as needed.
- 2. CAB's Open Mic Night has two goals: to provide an open platform for artistic expression, and to help build a diverse creative community that supports others
- 3. Open mic performances on any given night may include frank and honest language and difficult or challenging themes. As a performer, use what is necessary to tell your story and express yourself artistically, while keeping in mind that your audience is a diverse group of humans with different life experiences, backgrounds, and points of view.
- 4. Our first unbreakable rule when you are on-mic is to treat people with respect: the audience and yourself.
- 5. **Our second** Respect our equipment. It is expensive and disrespect will not be tolerated. If you damage the equipment, you'll be required to pay for it.
 - a. Our equipment will include
 - i. Sound system/amp, 2 speakers, 2 microphones/stands, 1 monitor, guitar plug in ability, stool or chair
 - b. If you have background music, make sure it is ready to play on your phone or computer.
 - i. We will have an aux cord and a headphone jack to plug into our sound system
 - c. Guitarists please bring your cable and ¼ inch plug. If you have other inputs, please let us know prior.

6. Others:

- a. **Be Prepared** Be ready when your name is called to perform. Have your equipment ready and tuned up before you go on stage.
- b. **This is not a competition** The audience is not judging you. They are here to make a connection with you and to have a good time. Share your talent. This is not "Showtime at the Lair," or any other famous show.
- c. Stick to time: Know the time limit and please stick to it
- d. Stay and Watch: Stay to watch other performers

7. Audience:

- a. As an audience member, remember that it's a risk to share your music, writing, or other art with the world, and support performers by being attentive and respectful.
 - i. Remember this is not a competition, you are not a judge, and this is not "Showtime at the Lair," or any other famous show.
- b. Please try not to walk around during the event. The movement is distracting and can take attention away from the performer.
- c. Applause can be shown by: raising your hands in the air, finger snaps, clapping, dancing, etc.
- 8. Be the audience you'd like to have.
- 9. Have fun!

Please note that the HOST has the ability to mute microphones individually and as a group. This may be necessary at max time or other issues.

- Performers are allowed a maximum of 7 minutes. If space permits, we will allow more at end of show.
- Possible Genres:
 - o Rappers, Musicians, Singers, Poetry/Spoken Word, Theater, etc
