1	<b>GRIEVED</b> by the fact that well over 700 people were subject to capital punishment in 2018, and
2	
3	<b>CONCERNED</b> that roughly twenty-five people a year are killed by capital punishment in the
4	United States alone, and
5	
6	<b>ENCOURAGED</b> by the fact that an astounding 105 countries have abolished capital
7	punishment, with 35 countries progressing to abolish capital punishment, and
8	
9	<b>NOTING</b> that there are many different forms of capital punishment, including lethal injection,
10	electrocution, gas chambers, hanging, and firing squad, and
11	
12	<b>STRESSING</b> that the dignity of human life should be respected in all cases, even when someone
13	has committed a grave or serious crime;

15	1) <u>URGES</u> all countries that have not yet taken any steps to abolish capital punishment
16	to begin to work towards the act of abolishing capital punishment in all forms;

18	2) <b>RECOMMENDS</b> that the United Nations place sanctions on any countries that are
19	unwilling to abolish capital punishment;

21	3) <b>EXPRESSES THE HOPE</b> that through the efforts of the United Nations and its
22	member nations, all forms of capital punishment will be abolished within the next ten
23	years.
