- 3 <u>NOTING</u> that small arms refers to anything from a hand gun to small missiles all of which can cause great damage and the trade of these arms is a major problem across the world today and,
- 4 <u>AWARE</u> of the growing availability of these small arms being traded and how this is a growing problem that takes more lives each year, therefor causing more conflicts to occur throughout and,
- 5 <u>COMENDS</u> states that support actions against small arms and illicit trade for all the resources that have been used to make the world a safer and less violent place for future generations by keep these weapons from falling into the wrong hands,
 - URGES member nations to take action against these illegal trades in any way that
 they are able; either through creating programs to disarm, prevent the trade of these

 - 3) <u>RECOMENDS</u> that member states support and cooperate with the International Criminal Police Organization (INTERPOL) to recognize the parties whom are selling these weapons in such a manner that the illicit trade of small arms come to a stop.
