DEEPLY DISTURBED by the recent and growing violence in Hong Kong, where protesters, policemen and soldiers have been fighting against each other in a dangerous confrontation, caused by the struggle for Hong Kong's sovernrity, and

discriminatory towards the citizens of Hong Kong, that made it so criminals in Hong Kong could be put on trial in China, however

GRIEVED by a bill passed in July passed by the Chinese government which was

<u>EMPHASIZING</u> the lack of safety of the protesters in recent events caused by a law banning makes during a protest, while police still uses harmful chemical weapons, which has caused many injuries to occur, at the same time

<u>AWARE</u> that Hong Kong is not a true sovereign state but rather special case of sovereignty where China lets Hong Kong have some freedoms and powers granted by the Chinese government, and

<u>ANXIOUS</u> on instability of the peaceful protests that can turn violent fairly quickly resulting dangerous climate for Hong Kong's citizens;

1) <u>CALLS UPON</u> UN peacekeepers to help diffuse the ongoing and worsening protests that occurred in Hong Kong, and eliminate the destructive armed forces;

2) <u>REQUEST</u> China and Hong Kong have peace talks about Hong Kong's citizens rights and the city finally becoming not just a special case rather a sovereign country of its own;

a) Any and all nations that wish to help with the peace talks or diffusing protests as long as Hong Kong and China unanimously give permission for the nations to do so,

b) The nations are respectful and do not over step their boundaries while assisting China and Hong Kong with the issue;

3) <u>STRESSES</u> the urgency of diffusing the situation because of the rapidly growing violence in the priests resulting in many injuries and destruction of the city of Hong Kong;

4) <u>EXPRESSES HOPE</u> that Hong Kong and China accepet the help that has been offered and work together to find a balance while letting Hong Kong be its own nation.
