- 1 REALIZING that human-trafficking is a global crisis, with more than an estimated twenty one
2 million people forced into labor and unwilling sexual situations, and
3
- 4 BELIEVING that monitoring the number of people forced in labor and unwilling sexual
5 situations would reduce the amount of people forced into such, and
6
- 7 EMPHASIZING that an Illicit Human-Trafficking Program could exist to help monitor the
8 trafficking of human people between countries, to completely eliminate human-trafficking for all
9 people, and
10
- 11 KEEPING IN MIND that many other countries are suffering from the trafficking of human
12 people, and that many of those countries have done nothing to fix this crisis, and
13
- 14 ALARMED that many countries are continual destinations for the forced labor and trafficking of
15 men, women and children;

- 17 1) STRONGLY SUPPORTS the creation of the Illicit Human-Trafficking Program to
18 monitor the trafficking of human people, and completely eliminate it, in time;

 - 20 2) EQUESTS that other countries to join this program, with the goal of eliminating
21 human-trafficking within the next fifty years;

 - 23 3) HOPES that other countries will participate in an annual forum to discuss tactics and
24 strategies in its efforts to successfully enforce the Illicit Human-Trafficking Program,
25 monitor the trafficking of human people, deliberate on repercussions, and completely
26 eliminate human-trafficking.
