

GUIDELINES FOR STAYING ON CAMPUS DURING 'SHELTER IN PLACE'

All students who are approved by the Office of Residence Life to stay on campus during this time must follow the guidelines below.

- 1) SHELTER IN PLACE ORDER BY THE STATE OF ILLINOIS
 - a) Students must stay in their assignment and may not leave campus except for essential activities, such getting groceries, going to the pharmacy, getting gas, etc.
 - b) All gatherings of more than 10 people are banned
 - c) All non-essential business and operations will be closed
- 2) ADHERE TO UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS
 - a) Students are not permitted to allow any guests into the residential areas at any time. This includes other students, even if they are approved to stay on campus.
 - b) Students may not proper doors open for within campus buildings as it is a safety hazard.
 - c) Students are still required to adhere to all university policies. Any student found responsible for violating a policy may be required to vacate their assignment immediately.
- 3) PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING – this is done to limit contact and decrease the potential for disease transmission.
 - a) Stay in your room, suite, or apartment and only leave when essential
 - b) Limiting contact with others living in your residential area
 - c) Stay 6 feet away from other individuals as much as possible
 - d) Cover your coughs and sneezes with your upper sleeve or a tissue and discard the tissue immediately in a waste basket. Never cough in the direction of another person.
 - e) Avoid sharing household items. Do not share drinking glasses, towels, eating utensils, bedding or any other items.
- 4) FOLLOW THE CENTER FOR DISEASE CONTROL GUIDELINES
 - a) Wash your hands with soap and water or use 60% alcohol-based hand sanitizer after coughing or sneezing or throwing a used tissue in the garbage.
 - b) When washing, do so for at least 20 seconds by rubbing hands together and making sure fingertips and nails are clean
 - c) Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth
 - d) Keep your surroundings clean. Try to clean surfaces that you share with others, such as doorknobs, telephones, and bathroom surfaces (or any other object that you sneeze or cough on), with a standard household disinfectant. Wash your hands after cleaning the area.
 - e) Monitor yourself for signs of possible infection, including fever, dry cough, or difficulty breathing.
